August 11th General Meeting at Venue 114


Venue 114 is now open for business, however due to current regulation of 4sqm spacing, our meeting will be conducted in **HALL 1 access via covered courtyard**. The ground floor location is due to the 2nd floor venue not meeting requirement for the number of members in our club and secondly only 2 persons can be accommodated in the lift on any trip. Definitely slow egress and regress from the venue.

Other changes:

- Entry fee for meeting has been increased to \$10.00 to cover the
 increase costs of morning tea. Following the Constitution protocol,
 this will be presented at the July meeting for ratification. Members
 are asked to bring the correct change to hand to the registrar.
- Morning Tea will be supplied by Venue 114, the service of which will address Department of Health Regulations and meet eco environment classification that the venue has obtained. All food will be supplied on washable crockery supplied by Venue 114 and washed on site.
 - Any member with **dietary requests** are asked to notify the Secretary **Julie Knight** so that their needs may be addressed. We are no longer able to self-cater at the venue.

We therefore ask members to ensure that they strive to have correct monies when paying for club activities or they pay directly into the club bank account.

If you pay online for a meeting it will have to be received at least a day prior to the meeting. Please ensure you identify the reason for the payment with your name. (i.e. Name, GM fee.) This is because your name will be passed on to the registrar for the meeting indicating you have paid.

Hopefully the next two months will enable us to resume more pre COVID-19 activities. I plan to review the yearly calendar during August and send out the last six months schedule of the Probus Year at the beginning of September. This will enable members to enter club activities into their personal diaries.

If Interest Group coordinators can forward me updated event schedules during July and August that would be appreciated.

the liberalized younger ones who fought, flew and nursed casualties.
