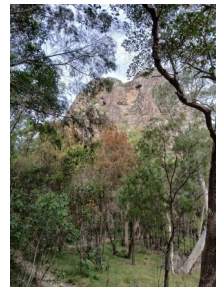
WALKING GROUP

WEARING OF BADGES

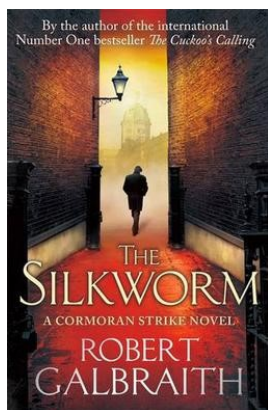

BUS TRIP FOR 2024

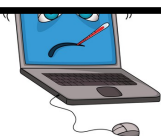

This month we have watched three movies. The first was 'Unsung Hero'.. This is the true story of the Australian Smallbone family. It was so beautifully made by Joel and Luke Smallbone in particular (King & Country band) , who are children in the movie. Some of the real 7 children acted in the movie also. It is a tale of triumph over defeat for a family who stuck together through all the odds in the difficult music industry in America. Their mother's faith held them together like glue. The following week was...'The Road to Patagonia', this is a doco style movie made by Australian, Matty Hammon and in part, portraying how he met the love of his life on the way. He interviewed many local people and now gives money to the causes that stop big companies from wrecking the ecosystem. A must see.
