Armchair Travel - Anna Firmin

The August meeting was presented by our Convenor, Anna Firmin, who gave us a



slideshow with commentary and a video of her recent Poseidon Expeditions/Chimu Adventures holiday to Antarctica, South Georgia and the Falkland Islands on board the luxury "Sea Spirit," a small ship which allows it to get to places the larger ships cannot. The theme of this voyage was The Story of Shackleton's Last Expedition 1914-17. The journey began at Ushuia, Argentina, the world's most southern city. This is a wild and unpredictable area and the journey through the Drake Passage had to be delayed one day to avoid 10 metre seas. They passed Elephant Island



where Shackleton's party spent a winter in appalling conditions. Each of the anchorages had excursions by Zodiacs including the Antarctica Peninsular. Viewing immense glaciers, huge icebergs and to get up close to whales and various species of seals, penguin colonies and birdlife was an experience. Expert staff on board the ship provided briefings and lectures on all aspects of the excursions and accompanied the passengers on the Zodiacs. Because of a Medical Evacuation through the airstrip at the Chilean Base, their trip to South Georgia was cancelled. The upside of this was that more time was spent in a scenic wilderness hosting millions of sea birds, seals and penguins that was the Falkland Islands, a piece of Britain in the Southern Ocean and its charming capital, Stanley, with a cathedral, museum, war memorial and shopping. We were given a video presentation which was prepared by the cameraman on board the

Sea Spirit and included many drone shots which brought a new aspect to the sights. This is a once in a lifetime experience and thank you Anna for sharing it with us.
