BOOK CLUB



Our Book Club meeting for January differs from the other eleven months in as much as there is no designated book to read.

We discuss titles we have read over the holidays and recommend some to read and some to avoid.

The regular, popular authors featured along with a few new ones, well new to some.

Jane Harper, an Australian author was popular with her new title "Exiles" with some intrigued as to the relevance of the title.

Most members enjoy a good mystery and authors' series, eg. Elly Griffiths and the Ruth Galloway Mysteries, Kerry Greenwood's Miss Fisher Stories . David Baldacci, " The 6th Man " & "The Tilt" by Chris Hammer, both popular authors and both books recommended to read

Spy stories are popular and David Silvas's "The Cellist" was one recommended. Set in Europe, themes of political propaganda, real world events, corruptions & influences on fragile democracies. Interesting characters & full of suspense.

For history /research buffs, Richard Fidler's "Ghost Empire" set around Istanbul (once Constantinople) whilst fiction, with a human story, explores 1000 years of history from the Romans through to the Muslims. Outstanding research, a travelogue of history.

Peter Fitzsimons, "Battle of Long Tan" was very well researched. It brings history to life, hugely detailed and relates the absurdity of men in command making impractical life & death decisions whereas those of less standing override their orders and succeed. Wrong people awarded, actual heroes took years to be recognised. One of our members was personally involved. A compelling narrative, best P.F's book.

A new author to most, Norwegian Gunner Staalesen 's detective novel, "Yours until death" worth the read and author Neela Janakiramanan's "The Registrar" story of a reconstructive hand surgeon & the situations she becomes involved in. Riverting & highly recommended.
