No, we are not moving! A number of alternative venues for our monthly Business Meetings have been reviewed, but nothing quite matches up to the convenience of our current location.



Armchair Travel - Anna Firmin

As Judy White was unable to present her talk I decided to do something different.... Always a challenge but I think it worked! I had ten cards with titles on them: Scariest event, Lost luggage, Smells/odours –best/worst, My dream destination, Small world encounter, etc.

Each person pulled out a card, read the title and we had open discussion on that topic. Some which I remember: **Scariest event**: both Bett and Lorrain recounted their cruises up the African coast with its threat of pirates. These two always manage to have us laughing with their stories. I had a card with "Laundry" on it just to hear Lorraine repeat her story of her experience in the laundry on the "Queen Mary". Back to the Scariest, Graeme Rowe got mugged in New York! He learned the lesson of having an old wallet with out-of-date licence and a few small denomination notes on him to hand over if it happened again!

Life changing encounter: Graeme was on business in New York and at dinner in a restaurant where a party was celebrating the birthday of an elderly woman. On the spur of the moment he sent a bottle of Champagne across with birthday wishes. This led to a long friendship and the guy was the World President of Prudential!! Lorraine was living on a 46' yacht in a marina in the Melbourne area. Working shift work as a nurse she really wanted a phone but found the system to get one was not easy. One night she was nursing a guy who happened to ask her where she lived, she said on a yacht in a marina. "Is there anything you want/need?" "A phone!" was the answer. Within days this was supplied!!

Border Crossings: I took the chance to relate my experience of spending seven hours at the Singapore/Malaysian border while the rest of a group spent the day touring Jahor Baru all because I was born in Kenya and did not have my onward ticket! Trevor related the problem they often encounter at borders because his wife, Pam, does not have any prints on her fingers!!

Under **Lost luggage** Mike told a story about a travelling companion who totally mislaid her top plate. It was nowhere to be found in their room before departing. From another hotel in the chain they made follow up phone calls to no avail. On returning home the friend put in a claim under "lost luggage" which the company agreed the loss could be covered. The cheque arrived: \$700+ less depreciation for seven years: They had sent a cheque for \$4.00.

It was a lot of fun and I think everyone enjoyed the discussions and, of course, red herrings which cropped up. The October meeting will be Judy White, back from Torres Strait. Judy will talk about her trip to Dauan Island.

Guest Speaker: Geoff Clements from RACQ LifeFlight Rescue.

Geoff gave us a fascinating talk on RACQ LifeFlight Rescue.

LifeFlight's motto is "Saving lives.... Anyone.... Anywhere.... Anytime." And this is just what they do in Queensland. The LifeFlight Foundation is a community-based organisation that funds and supports the emergency aeromedical services of LifeFlight Australia.

RACQ LifeFlight Rescue began with a single-engine helicopter, a team of one permanent pilot and 15 volunteer crewmen performing beach and surf patrols on the Gold Coast.

Now it is a multi-faceted service with a fleet of 12 helicopters, including four state-of-the-art AW139



helicopters and four Air Ambulance jets operating 24/7 from 13 locations across Queensland. There are more than 400 employees.

The Air Ambulance jets are Learjets specifically fitted out for

their operation to provide the finest aeromedical care to members of the public in need of evacuation to an hospital both here and overseas.

They have been operating for over 37 years with over 50,000 missions flown - both international and domestic rapid response medical care flights.

This operation is not cheap as each mission costs \$12,500 to get off the ground, at no cost to those saved. Each flight has a pilot, co-pilot, paramedic and a critical care doctor on board.

LifeFlight covers **search and rescue**. Such as locating and rescuing climbers in the hinterland of the Sunshine Coast and assisting the Coast Guard with rescues at sea.

They are called on to carry out **interfacility transfers**. Such as from the Sunshine Coast University Hospital to Brisbane when necessary including calls for any neonatal transfers which may be from a remote pastoral homestead or country town base medical facility to a major hospital.

Motor vehicle accidents on stations, outback roads as well as the main highways are statistically the major work for the RACQ LifeFlight Rescue helicopters.

Counter disaster work including bush fires or floods involve the RACQ LifeFlight Rescue helicopters. The challenging rescues from fast-flowing rivers is often shown on TV news bulletins.

Geoff gave us the statistics for the **June** operations on the Sunshine and Fraser Coasts as follows:

Interfacility transfer 26
Primary 9
Motor Vehicle 3
Winch - hikers/climbers 1

Sunshine Coast-based RACQ LifeFlight Rescue flew 450 lifesaving missions, costing \$5.6 million in 2017-2018 financial year.
