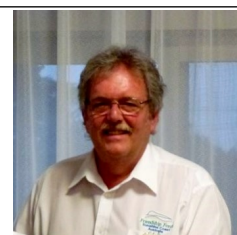

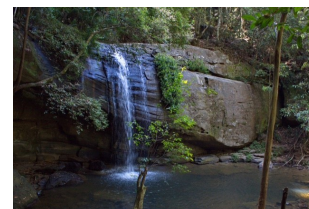

Hamish Sawyer

In 2008 the current building became the Regional Art Gallery. It is not a big area and since amalgamation, it serves a much larger local Government area and must appeal to a far wider audience. It is a challenge to mount exhibitions.

Hamish gave a rundown of the workings of this Gallery and explained the challenges he faces as curator. He acknowledged the support of the Friends of the Gallery in fundraising for construction and mounting local exhibitions. The demographic is changing with younger families moving into the area and we have a high tourism/visitor presence in the region. They try to appeal to these different audiences.

He ran through the plan for a 12-month timetable of exhibitions to appeal to as wider audience as they can.

Touring Exhibitions: one a year. Provide regional galleries with exhibitions which would not usually be available to the smaller Regional Galleries. The first exhibition for the year is Ross Manning – Dissonant Rhythms. New Media – art which is engaged in new technology. Ross makes his own musical instruments by taking apart old instruments, equipment such as fans, overhead projectors constructs kinetic sculptures. They emit light and sound. This is an example of a Touring Exhibition.

Following on is Margaret Ellen Taylor and three other local painters. These paintings depicting space through landscape or more abstract subjects. They will be recreating studios so visitors can get an idea of an artist's working space. This will be an interactive exhibition.

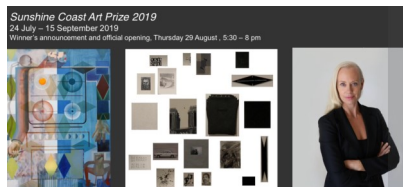
The next exhibition the gallery is split into two. One part will be works by Bianca Beatson who is a Kabi local indigenous group. Bianca is a lecturer at the Queensland College of Art, she leads their indigenous art program which is only program of its kind in Australia. This is a photographic exhibition. Alongside this will be an exhibition from the Gallery's collection. Many works from this collection are hanging in offices and public spaces in the Region. The theme is the local landscape and several local artists have been invited to do work to be included in this exhibition. The Sunshine Coast Art Prize is an annual event which has entries from all over Australia. The judge this year is Alison Kutcher from the National Gallery of Australia. This is from 24 July to 15 September. "Local Artist, Local Content Art Prize" which has usually followed on from the Art Prize, is going to be moved to January 2020.

In association with the Print Council of Australia, there will be an exhibition entitled "The Kyoto Hanga International Print Exhibition: Japan and Australia. The dates: 19 Sept. to 10 November. There will be works from 25 printmakers for around Australia as well as from three local printmakers.

The CRG has a space at the Maroochydore Library Building. Promoting local artists who are able sell their works from this venue.

Markets held twice a year. These include jewelry and other crafts and these events are growing in popularity annually.

There are lots of other events, activities going on from the CRG out to various parts of this large Region.
